Associate Prof, Dr Mike Armour (PhD)

Presentation: How can we produce conducive Chinese herbal medicine case reports to inform the community?

Assoc Prof Dr Mike Armour is an experienced traditional Chinese medicine (TCM) practitioner with a specific focus on endometriosis and pelvic pain. Mike completed his honours degree in biomedicine at the University of Auckland before going on to study traditional Chinese medicine and acupuncture. Mike is an associate professor in reproductive health at NICM Health Research Institute, Western Sydney University where he is currently running several clinical trials on endometriosis, menstrual health, and complementary medicine.

Mike has published over 100 peer reviewed articles on various aspects of women's health including medicinal cannabis and both western and Chinese herbal medicine. Mike has had significant media attention on his work including 14 articles in The Conversation, an SBS Insight special on endometriosis, an SBS special on herbal medicine for period pain and over 300 pieces of international news media with an estimated readership of 80 million across over 100 countries including Channel 7 News, ABC News, and The Guardian.

Mike is heavily involved in research and treatment of endometriosis, and he was the invited complementary medicine expert on the endometriosis expert working group (EEWG) for the Royal Australia and New Zealand College of Gynaecologists (RANZCOG) that developed the first Australian guidelines for Endometriosis, released in January 2021. Mike is also a World Endometriosis Society Ambassador, Chair of Endometriosis Australia's clinical advisory committee, Chair of Endometriosis Australia's research committee, Academic lead of the Menstrual Cycle Research Network (MCRN) at Western Sydney University and Chair of the Australasian Interdisciplinary Researchers in Endometriosis (AIRE).



Matthew Bauer

Presentation: A Tale of Two Campaigns – Peripheral Neuropathy and Problems with Acupuncture Research

Matthew has been successfully treating Peripheral neuropathy for 40 years. In addition to his years in full-time practice in Southern California, Matthew has written two books, dozens of articles, and co-authored a peer-reviewed article on acupuncture dosage and another on electro-acupuncture for peripheral neuropathy. He founded the non-profit

Acupuncture Now Foundation in 2014 to educate the public, healthcare providers and health policymakers about the benefits of acupuncture.



Dr Chris Bowden (PhD)

Presentation: Trauma Informed Care

Dr. Chris Bowden is a lecturer in Te Puna Akopai/School of Education at Te Herenga Waka/Victoria University of Wellington. He teaches child and adolescent development in the undergraduate programme, child and adolescent mental health and counselling in the Masters of Educational Psychology programme. His areas of expertise include: grief and loss, coping and resiliency, complex/interpersonal trauma and trauma-informed and resiliency-oriented education, counselling/therapy and interventions that are trauma-focused. His research focuses on suicide postvention and suicide bereavement, male childhood sexual abuse survivorship, resiliency, and wellbeing.

Chris has authored and co-authored research journal articles; contributed to government reports on suicide prevention, early childhood resiliency, and childhood sexual abuse; and written best-practice guidelines for those working with victims/survivors. Chris is passionate about developing more trauma-informed systems and helping people develop more compassionate, safe, and evidence-based effective responses to people affected by trauma, grief, and loss. He developed Waves New Zealand's first national psychoeducational support programme for people bereaved by suicide in partnership with Skylight. Chris's is also a community educator, and trainer and provides advice to regional suicide prevention and postvention coordinators. He is the Academic Director for Mates in Construction NZ who work to prevent suicide in the construction sector, a member of the Mental Health Foundation's Suicide Bereavement Service Lived Experience Advisory Group and was an agent of Child and Youth Mortality Review Group for the Hutt Valley and CCDHBs. He received a LifeKeepers National Suicide Prevention Award in 2018.



Nicola Douglas

Presentation: Cultivating Purpose & Supporting Transformation During Menopause

Nicola practices in New Plymouth, with a special interest in working in women's health, from menarche to menopause - and everything in between. She comes from a background in Nursing and while her roots are firmly planted in east Asian medicine now, she enjoys an integrative approach within her practice. Her eclectic learning style includes a Diploma in Fertility Acupuncture, while more recently she has taken a deep dive into Classical Chinese Medicine Her mission is to empower women to understand and take control of their own health.



Jolie Davis (Ngāti Kurī, Te Rarawa)

Jolie is the founder and lead practitioner of Manawa Ora Mirimiri and Workshops, the largest provider of Rongoā Māori in the Wellington region. Jolie is a member of the ACC Rongoā Māori Advisory Panel.

A trained nurse, Jolie brings some 25 plus years' experience as a traditionally trained Mirimiri Romiromi practitioner, educator and advocate, active in revitalising Rongoā Māori, the original system of health and wellbeing in Aotearoa New Zealand. Since moving her practice to the Wellington region in 2019, Jolie has trained numerous practitioners and grown Manawa Ora to a staff of fourteen, plus volunteers. Manawa Ora provides some 6,000 treatments each year through its Ngauranga clinic alone, complemented by regular community clinics, workshops and education in workplaces and tertiary institutions across Wellington and beyond. Each week you'll find Jolie where she is most at home: training the next generation of practitioners; sharing matauranga; alleviating pain, stress and distress in whānau; and supporting whānau to find wellbeing and self-empowerment through healing. In her spare time, Jolie enjoys performing with the Pacific Connection Choir.



Vanessa Eldridge

Presentation: Ūtaina Ōmahu

Vanessa Eldridge (Rongomaiwahine, Ngāti Kahungūnu) is an Associate with Te Arahanga o Ngā Iwi – an agency focussed on Māori development. She also works with Te Piringa Hapu Authority Trust in Omaha Heretaunga with a focus on wellbeing and the recovery from Cyclone Gabrielle. She has a background in nursing and has led and developed several programmes relating to loss and grief for Māori, compassionate communities in her previous roles within Palliative Care.

Vanessa has contributed to national research, publications and professional development material and is a qualified bi-cultural supervisor. Vanessa has two sons and lives in Wellington.



Dr Richard Everts

Dr Everts is a hospital and community Infectious Disease Specialist Physician and Medical Microbiologist, based in Nelson and Marlborough in New Zealand. David Hartmann

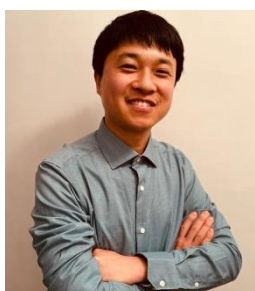

David Hartmann lives in Brisbane, Australia and has been practicing acupuncture since 1997 (graduating at the age of just 23). He has also been a Chinese medicine lecturer at various colleges since 2000. Currently, he is researching, developing, writing, and presenting workshops nationally and internationally, both live in-person and online.

David has written two textbooks on Chinese medicine – ‘*The Principles and Practical Application of Acupuncture Point Combinations*’ (published by Singing Dragon in 2020) and ‘*Acupoint Dictionary 2e*’ (published by Elsevier Churchill Livingstone as a 2nd edition in 2009). David had a busy 2009. Apart from writing the Acupoint Dictionary he also completed his Masters of Acupuncture with his Project Thesis titled “How did Ancient Confucianism view Virtue? Can it be incorporated into a Modern Western World?”.

David has written courses, presented at conferences, and done his own stand-alone seminars in fifteen countries around the world. He has also developed online workshops for eleven companies world-wide.



Dawson Guangyi Huang

Presentation: The connection between Yi Jing(I-Ching) and Chinese Medicine

Dawson obtained his Bachelor of Chinese Medicine from Henan University of TCM in 2009. Situated in the Yellow River Basin, his university was in the heart of ancient Chinese civilization. During his studies, Dawson delved deeply into Chinese ancient history and culture, even visiting the birthplace of Zhouyi (周易) to observe the Tai Chi Bagua Formation. This profound understanding greatly shapes his clinical practice. As a skilled practitioner, he has aided patients from over 70 countries. Dawson is also the

founder of the Taiji International TCM Foundation, dedicated to helping TCM practitioners enhance their knowledge and skills.



Huanlin Lynn Huang

Presentation: The application of ear seeds in relieving anxiety

Huanlin (Lynn) Huang is a CMCNZ registered practitioner, also a specialist in Education and Mental Health. Her expertise stems from rigorous training in TCM and acupuncture at Southern Medical University (formerly the First Military Medical University) in China, where she earned her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in TCM and Clinical Medicine.

Lynn is currently working as a program leader at the New Zealand School of Acupuncture and Traditional Chinese Medicine (NZSATCM). Beyond her academic roles,

Lynn is actively involved in global initiatives within the realm of TCM. She serves as an executive board member of the 10th Executive Committee of the WFAS and an executive council member of the 1st Board of the Specialty Committee of Fuyang of the WFCMS.



Heiko Lade

Presentation: Introduction to Tung Style Acupuncture

Heiko Lade will have been in practice this 2024 for 40 years. Initially he completed a Diploma of TCM from The NSW College of Natural Therapies before working in China, Hangzhou in 1984. Upon his return from China he worked in Sydney Chinatown where he further developed his herbal skills. He completed a Masters in TCM in the late 1990's and moved to New Zealand where he has been living for over 20 years. Whilst in New

Zealand, he has taught acupuncture and Chinese herbs both in Christchurch and Auckland before residing in Hawkes Bay, where he has been for over 15 years.



Peter Larking

Presentation: Neuropuncture and Long Covid and a demonstration on Vagus nerve stimulation

Peter has studied and practiced Chinese medicine for 26 years. In that time, he has achieved a Bachelor of Health Sciences specializing in acupuncture, Diplomas in Tuina, Qigong, Taijiquan and has recently completed cadaver research at the MARC Institute, Miami, achieving the upper torso, head, face, brain, and spine dissection module. He is a former teacher and faculty member at the New Zealand School of Acupuncture

lecturing in Bio medical sciences, Neurological anatomy, Chinese Medical theory, Acupuncture, Tuina, Qi gong, Taijiquan. Peter is a specialist and teacher in electro-acupuncture modalities and is a certified Neuropuncture practitioner and instructor. Peter currently works as the medical director of Neuromedtec in New Zealand and represents Neuropuncture Inc as an instructor. Peter is now a candidate for a doctoral in neuroscience acupuncture and will be beginning his research dissertation in electro acupuncture for treatment of cognitive and mental health impairment in post-concussion syndrome later this year.

Presentation: Tongue Diagnosis for Common and Complex Gynecological Disorders: Findings for Fibroids, Cysts, Breast Diseases and Gynecological Cancers

Dr. Evan M. Rabinowitz is the founder of Yao Shan Center for Chinese Medicine in Washington, DC. where he has had an active clinical practice for the last 23 years. He is a professor at Daoist Traditions College of Chinese Medical Arts, Asheville, North Carolina. Evan served as Director of Chinese Herbal Medicine at the Maryland

University of Integrative Health (MUIH) until 2018. During his 8 year tenure he was instrumental in the creation of the University's Masters and Doctorate programs in Oriental Medicine. Previously, he was an instructor and Chinese herbal supervisor at the Academy for Five Element Acupuncture, Gainesville, Florida. He is currently a lecturer at Georgetown University School of Medicine within its integrative medicine and health sciences master's degree program and has been a guest lecturer on Asian medicine and philosophy at various colleges and universities around the United States. Evan studied extensively with Jeffrey Yuen for two decades. He is a graduate of the George Washington University (B.A.), Traditional Acupuncture Institute (M.Ac.) and Maryland University of Integrative Health (D.Ac.). He has an active private teaching schedule, offering continuing education for practitioners across the country and internationally.

Evan is the director of Yao Shan Seminars, an online platform for Chinese Medicine continuing education. Currently, he teaches an online, 10-month comprehensive training program in Chinese Herbal Medicine, Yao Shan Herb Program, in addition to his multiple online and in-person courses.

Presentation: Regulatory Remedies: Ensuring Lawful and Ethical Advertising of Chinese Medicine in NZ

Kate Roberts holds a PhD in Primary Health Care, a Masters in Traditional Chinese Medicine, a Post-graduate Certificate in Psychological Medicine and a Bachelors of Acupuncture.
